

State COVID-Operation Snapshot for Arkansas

Effective July 20, 2020, Governor Asa Hutchinson has issued a mandatory mask mandate for residents and visitors in Arkansas. Everyone will be required to wear masks in public spaces to help reduce the spread of COVID-19. For more information on this mandate see link below.

Gov. Asa Hutchinson announced a statewide mask mandate at a July 16 press briefing. The order, which took effect July 20, exempts children under the age of 10 (see link below).

Effective June 15, 2020, there is now no quarantine requirement for travelers entering Arkansas based on the location they traveled from. This includes both domestic and international travel.

Arkansas has not imposed a stay at home order throughout the COVID-19 outbreak, though a March 25 executive order by Gov. Hutchinson restricted mass gathering to no more than 10 people. It is in place indefinitely.

On May 5, Governor Asa Hutchinson has extended Arkansas's COVID-19 public health and disaster emergency for an additional 45 days. You can find updated order in the link below.
