

State COVID-Operation Snapshot for North Dakota

Statewide Mask Order: No.

The state encourages employers to recommend staff and customers wear face coverings where it is difficult to maintain social distancing, but there is no statewide requirement.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No.

Current Executive Order Status: Smart Restart Plan Moderate Risk

On April 29, Gov. Burgum issued an executive order with smart restart protocols for businesses resuming or continuing operations.

Previously on March 27, Gov. Burgum issued an executive order shutting down bars, restaurants and other public retail businesses with no apparent impact on manufacturers. On April 16, he extended that through April 30.

The ND Department of Public health updated on April 8 travel restrictions requiring those traveling from international destinations or other parts of the United States to self-quarantine for 14 days upon arrival in North Dakota. The order exempts critical infrastructure workers as defined by the federal CISA guidance.

On April 6, the mayors of Fargo and West Fargo issued a limited “Stay Home, Stay Healthy” order with no apparent impact on manufacturers. The order reinforces Gov. Burgum’s directives, urges retail businesses to limit occupancy and encourages other businesses that continue operating to practice social distancing, sanitization and telework.
